UAE President Sheikh Mohamed declared 2023 the Year of Sustainability. It is also the year of COP28 – with world leaders convening in the UAE at the end of 2023 to accelerate the global response to climate change.

Connect with Nature will continue to build on its success of inspiring and empowering youth to shape a planet-friendly society in the UAE, with a special focus on encouraging youth to volunteer as citizen scientists and make meaningful contributions to scientific research and environmental conservation in the UAE.

Youth makes up a significant portion of the world's population. It is estimated that half of the human population is under 30 years old. In the UAE, roughly 75 percent of the population of three million is under the age of 35 years, and 25 percent of the population between the ages 20 and 35 years.

OVERVIEW OF 2022 PROJECTS

Empowering Future Leaders of Sustainability

In 2022, we introduced new milestones for our youth to unlock on their leadership journey. **Our focus was on equipping youth with transformative skills such as leadership, communications, critical thinking, project planning and working as a team,** which will be invaluable in their future roles and careers.

At the heart of our skill development efforts was the first ever Connect with Nature Youth Leadership Summer Bootcamp – a three week programme that trained a select number of elite youth aged 18-24 in biodiversity, UAE's natural heritage, climate change and the role of leadership and civil society in effecting meaningful change. Youth participating in the bootcamp engaged in field trips to a pearl farm, a recycling plant, a Kayak 4 Conservation trip and attended workshops around recycling and air quality. They also worked on individual microprojects around sustainability.

The bootcamp was a great success and proved that, with education and the skill development, our youth are capable of leading their communities towards a more sustainable future.

Digital Transformation for a Greener Future

We are proud to have launched a completely revamped mobile app for Connect with Nature this year, **successfully completing the transition of Connect with Nature to a mobile app-focused programme.**

The new app provides an improved, smooth user experience which makes it easier for youth to participate with Connect with Nature. Youth can browse through a dynamic event calendar, book and register for activities directly through the app, and track their participation and impact. They can also interact with Connect with Nature and other members of the community through social media platforms.

In the first few weeks of launch itself, hundreds of youth downloaded the new app. A social media campaign is currently underway to promote the new app and expand the growing movement.

The Earth Prize: Two of our Youth Ambassadors for Nature – Hoor Al Rais and Lara Rudar – were selected as finalists in this global youth competition for 13 – 19 year olds, which seeks solutions to our most pressing

environmental challenges. They were selected out of 650 submissions from 114 countries, and were the only team from the Middle East and the only not affiliated with a school to advance to the final phase.

Their concept of creating a digital platform to increase awareness, investment opportunities and volunteerism for climate action has already caught the attention of prospective investors.

Food for Future: As the knowledge partner of this international summit, Connect with Nature participated in youth engagement activities, and joined the judging panel for the youth competition. Our **Youth Ambassador** for Nature Lara Rudar conducted a food security workshop for participating students in which youth participants estimated their food footprint and learned about the impact of their food habits and choices.



International Conference on Sustainability and **Education:** We supported the Environment Agency - Abu Dhabi's participation in this conference by

presenting an overview of Connect with Nature - the programme goals, objectives, success stories, Youth Ambassadors for Nature initiative and the future plans that continue to support the transformation of UAE youth into future sustainability leaders.



UN Biodiversity Conference (COP15): Our Youth Ambassador for Nature Denice Henson was accredited by the Global Youth Biodiversity Network and held three roles at the COP15 *conference in Montreal. She was as a Global Youth Biodiversity* Network delegate, part of the Youth Task Force and a member of the COP15 Youth Policy Team.



Stockholm+50: Youth Ambassador for Nature Lara Rudar represented Connect with Nature at this international meeting convened by the UN to catalyse action for a healthy environment.



COP27: Youth Ambassador for Nature Hoor Al Rais was selected as the first youth climate *delegate* and presented the youth delegate programme on behalf of the UAE at the COP27 climate change conference in Egypt.





Expanding the Youth Movement for Nature and Environmental Sustainability

We began the year with a **Recognition Ceremony to celebrate our Youth Ambassadors for Nature,** marking the conclusion of their journey with the ambassador programme and the **beginning of their new journeys in life.** 12 ambassadors enjoyed exclusive access to the Wadi Wurayah National Park in Fujairah – the first protected mountain area in UAE.

Throughout 2022, we continued to **expand our youth movement** with a busy calendar of in-person events designed to connect even more youth to nature and to **spark new journeys of transformational growth**. Youth participated in clean ups in a variety of natural habitats, from the mountains of Jebel Hafeet, to the beaches of Saadiyat Island and the mangroves of UAE. They collected information about plants and habitats; and surveyed, geo-tagged and removed litter from these vulnerable ecosystems **to inform national policies on single-use plastic.**

Youth also participated as citizen scientists and contributed to scientific research by reviewing neverseen-before camera trap footage of wildlife in the UAE. They participated in workshops on air pollution, the circular economy and recycling; visited the Al Wathba Reserve to learn about preserving wetlands; assisted scientists in planting mangroves and monitoring biodiversity in the area; and helped experts restore a traditional falaj irrigation system at Al Bithnah Village. • Connect with Nature youth participants also engaged in the Environment Agency of Abu Dhabi's educational and outreach events throughout the year, participating in the Environmental Youth Talk, Mission to Zero, Sawalef Be'eyah, Ecosystem Restoration Youth Circle, Youth Climate Change Survey and clean ups at Khalifa City, Al Shawamekh and Mussafah Beach.

 On World Environment Day, three youth were given a platform to share their success stories and journeys in different areas of sustainability: Biomimicry, Zero Waste and Climate Action. Six of our former UAE Youth Ambassadors for Nature joined us in attending a Unilever Event on the circular economy, and impressed business and government leaders with their knowledge and interest in advancing sustainable processes.

• During **Earth Hour**, youth participated in a **parade for the environment** at Expo 2020, during which 60 pavilions turned off their lights for one minute each as the parade proceeded throughout the site.

Building on our success in the past few years, we look forward to continuing our activities that encourage youth to discover the natural wonders of the UAE while also building the leadership skills necessary to uphold the legacy of the late Sheikh Zayed.

In 2023, we will also grow opportunities for youth in the UAE to act for nature as citizen scientists under the umbrella of Sahim – the Public Participation in Scientific Research (PSSR) initiative.

Citizen science enables members of the public to contribute to scientific research, thus involving more people in the collection and analysis of data and accelerating the speed with which scientists and environmentalists can address real-world issues that affect us all.

This initiative will give youth the opportunity to participate in a diverse range of environmental projects and learn new things from experts as they collaborate with scientists. **Youth** will have the platform to make meaningful contributions to scientific research in the UAE and support decision-making around environmental conservation and sustainability. **Sahim** also encourages a spirit of volunteerism amongst youth in the UAE, which is critical to supporting their character development and developing a larger sense of purpose and responsibility towards the community.

Sahim launches at a critical time as the UAE gears up to host the important COP28 climate conference and welcome global heads of state, climate experts and delegates towards the end of 2023. This crucial event is already generating keen interest in sustainability and climate action across the UAE. We look forward to engaging with youth on the pressing issue of climate change and exploring opportunities for our future leaders to get involved in national and international climate conversations.

We are excited to continue growing the Connect with Nature youth movement in 2023, by helping more youth spend time in nature; transforming youth into advocates for the environment; and helping them reach their potential as future leaders of sustainability.
