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FOREWORD

NURTURING A YOUTH MOVEMENT FOR NATURE

Connect with Nature was founded in 2019 with the vision of inspiring young people in the UAE to experience, celebrate and safeguard the UAE's natural heritage.

Over the past five years, the movement has grown beyond our expectations, reaching more than 2.5 million youth and mobilizing 14,000 youth to take action for nature. This remarkable milestone is a testament not only to our commitment to our future leaders, but also UAE youth's passion for nature and their determination to be part of the solution for a sustainable future.

When the UN Decade for Ecosystem Restoration was launched in 2021, our thriving community was prepared to



take action. Attracting the attention of young adults is not always easy, but thankfully Connect with Nature witnessed strong participation from the beginning, with youth signing up in droves for exciting excursions into UAE's natural landscapes – our wadis, deserts, wetlands and coastal lagoons.

These trips provide youth a safe way to explore the nation, with the guidance of environmental experts. They are designed to be fun and social, to invite youth to experience something new, and to **build their comfort and confidence** in nature. Buoyed by the popularity of these activities, Connect with Nature has grown to organize **250 events** across the country as well as online.

Many of these events have taken place amidst the rich natural ecosystems and reserves in the emirate of Abu Dhabi, with popular events like **Kayak 4 Mangroves** and **Turtle Patrol on Saadiyat Island** becoming regular fixtures in Connect with Nature's annual calendar of events. Abu Dhabi youth have flocked to these and other events in large numbers, with their energetic spirits and can-do attitudes.

The community impressed us with their eagerness to take this journey further — and our "for youth, by youth" approach empowered them to learn from their peers - upskilling their knowledge of nature, biodiversity and climate, while also developing leadership skills through masterclasses, training sessions and a more intense hands-on bootcamp series. Across these sessions and workshops, youth developed their own nature and climate solutions — one of which has even been selected as a **finalist in the global Earth Prize** youth competition.

More than **60 promising youth change makers** have evolved into environmental leaders and Ambassadors for Nature, organizing their own community participation events and advocating for nature on the regional and global stage.



We envision a future in which people and nature thrive side by side. A future in which businesses are powered by clean and innovative technologies; where products are eco-friendly, people consume mindfully, and litter is disposed of responsibly. A future that can sustain humanity for generations to come.

To achieve this, we need inventors, entrepreneurs, change makers and leaders who will prioritize nature and sustainability in decision-making.

This vision gave rise to Connect with Nature – a movement that brings younger generations closer to nature and equips them with the knowledge, capacity and opportunity to spearhead the transformation towards a sustainable future.

The natural historian Sir David
Attenborough famously said: "No
one will protect what they don't care
about; and no one will care about what
they have never experienced." This
profound insight stuck with us as we
designed Connect with Nature and
created opportunities for youth to
not only experience nature, but also
environmental science, ideation and the
power of advocacy.

Across these activities, youth demonstrated a keen grasp of complex issues, a passion for innovation, and the resolve to advance solutions. Their dedication and connection to nature persevered through the COVID-19 pandemic, as activities moved online and we explored creative ways to keep the community engaged. For instance, during the virtual Reimagine Youth Circle series of video calls, youth confidently presented their views and solutions to highlevel decision-makers, including UAE Ministers of State, business leaders and industry specialists. Since then, they have eloquently represented the youth voice at prominent local and global events including the Food for Future Summit, Stockholm+50, COP15, COP27 and COP28.

At COP28, our **Youth Insiders** – young professionals who are already championing sustainability in their workplaces – impressed us with their advice on overcoming hurdles and transforming large corporations from within. Within our neighbourhoods, youth **Ambassadors for Nature** are leading grassroots initiatives to raise awareness about environmental issues and mobilize communities to act.

Connect with Nature has granted us front-row seats to witness the evolution of UAE's youth into inspiring, ambitious leaders. It is with great pride that I follow their progress, and with great hope that I welcome the newest members to our movement.

WHAT IS CONNECT WITH NATURE?

Connect with Nature takes UAE youth through a transformational journey that shapes how they value and prioritise nature. The programme is designed to captivate youth's minds, touch their hearts and inspire meaningful actions.

It encourages youth to **Re-wild**, **Re-think** and **Become the Change**, offering carefully planned activities across four strategic pillars of engagement:





REACH:

In this initial stage, youth begin to see important messages about conservation and what it means to embrace a sustainable lifestyle. They recognize Connect with Nature is a way to engage more deeply with these issues and sign up to join the movement.



EXPLORE:

Youth commence their journey by 're-wilding'

– getting outside, experiencing nature and
developing a sense of adventure. Connect
with Nature offers hundreds of exciting
activities such as **Desert Survival trips** and **Moonlight Kayaking** to encourage teenagers
and young adults to explore the UAE's
unique natural heritage.



IMPACT:

Gradually, youth move from learning about environmental issues to doing their part. They begin volunteering as **citizen scientists**, as Connect with Nature integrates Public Participation in Scientific Research (PPSR) into field activities. Sustainability considerations are now driving their behaviour and decision-making.



LEAD:

A core group of youth change makers are developing skills through masterclasses and training bootcamps. Through action and dialogue, they are beginning to lead their communities by organizing their own events. They are now confident to challenge the status quo and shape a sustainable future.








WE ARE TRANSFORMING HEARTS AND MINDS



OUR FIRST TRIP

Many of us have visited the mangroves. But how many have paddled deep into the mangrove forests at night, under the calm cover of moonlight.

Our first Moonlight Kayaking adventure was magical and unforgettable, as we wove through mangrove trees and inky black water alive with nocturnal marine life. Truly immersed in nature, we heard about the harmonious relationship that binds the mangroves to the creatures they shelter - birds, crustaceans, and fish that make up our vibrant coastal wonderlands.

It's no surprise that Moonlight Kayaking has become one of our signature Connect with Nature activities, even now five years on.

THE COVID CONUNDRUM

Imagine trying to run a programme called 'Connect with Nature' during the COVID-19 pandemic, when we had to remain indoors to stay safe. Thankfully our creative team didn't miss a beat - they quickly found ways to keep our community motivated and focused on making a positive impact.

Even though we were physically apart, our community felt more connected than ever. We logged on to group Zoom calls with decision-makers and national leaders, directly speaking to them and sharing ideas to "Reimagine" a better, more sustainable future for all.

It was exhilarating to genuinely be heard and actually have a say in how our country moves forward. For most of us, it was our first time participating in such a serious, high-stakes conversation. It was eye-opening to realize that our voices could influence real-world policies and actions. Having gained this experience, we can confidently say - this is just the beginning!

UAE YOUTH ARE CAPABLE

By this point, the programme was set to give deserving youth a launchpad to become sustainability leaders in their communities and across the country. But how could we reach young people from all seven emirates, to let them know about this incredible opportunity?

We kicked off a nationwide search for youth 'Ambassadors for Nature,' calling on passionate change makers to apply for this prestigious title and receive hands-on training and mentorship from environmental leaders.

UAE youth answered the call, demonstrating their interest in nature and eagerness to advocate for sustainability. Over the years, two cohorts were selected, with, 30 homegrown heroes earning the title of Ambassador for Nature. They've since organized and led events for their communities and inspired others to explore, study and protect nature. Our ambassadors have also spoken up for nature at high-profile events such as the Food for Future Summit, Stockholm+50, COP15, COP27 and COP28 - standing tall as role models for the entire youth community.

In 2023, Ambassadors for Nature **Fayaz and Tamara**, successfully transitioned into full-time roles at Emirates Nature WWF, contributing to our mission and impact. In fact, Fayaz is leading the next cycle of the Ambassador programme.



MAKING SCIENCE AND NATURE ACCESSIBLE

Science is at the heart of tackling the nature-climate crisis, and there are already so many solutions just waiting to be put into action. To get people excited about these solutions—and make the science behind conservation a bit more fun—we came up with something creative and out of the box. Enter our nature-themed escape rooms, designed to reward teamwork and ignite action - especially with a 10-minute countdown timer flashing red in the corner.

First up was the Desert Survival escape room, where youth had to navigate a sandstorm in the Arabian Desert while protecting nature along the way. An amazing 2,800 participants took the challenge - through the physical escape room caravan and the online simulation we launched to keep the excitement going during the hot summer months.

Since then, the escape room has evolved, and in 2023—the Year of Sustainability and COP28—we launched the Mangrove Edition escape room. Operated by Connect with Nature volunteers, it is now touring the nation, demystifying Nature-based Solutions and inspiring thousands to take action for the planet.

I'm incredibly proud of the impact Connect with Nature has achieved in only five years. We have seen a noticeable cultural shift in young people in the UAE. It's now considered cool to spend weekends hiking, camping or visiting the mangroves, when not long ago there was a common misconception that you had to travel overseas to visit nature.





We've seen youth really step up and lead the movement amongst their peers. They've shown incredible leadership in creating an optimistic future for our planet. Many have been inspired by Connect with Nature to dive into education and science, prioritizing nature in their careers. Some have ventured into public policy, while others have found their place closer to nature, organizing community hikes and clean-up drives.

What started as an effort to introduce the community to local wildlife and wild spaces at our doorstep, has evolved into a movement of taking action.
