Mangroves are halophytes - plants that live in salt water. Mangroves get air from respiratory roots and excrete salt from the under-side of their leaves.

Mangroves are a critical part of coastal ecosystems providing shelter for fish, shrimp, crab, shells, barnacles and other species.

EAD maintains a network of protected areas throughout Abu Dhabi to preserve ecosystems including species such as the mangrove.

Grey mangrove range from the Maldives in the East to the African coasts in the West and from the Arabian Gulf in the North to South Africa.
